Often collaboratively, durationally and in series, Felicity Allen produces work through painting, writing, and film. Her resilient career is a manifestation of <u>The Disoeuvre</u>, a concept contesting the dominant art historical artist's oeuvre which has excluded many artists from recognition. Developed through her doctorate, this concept has been well-received and continues to underpin much of her work.

Aspects of Felicity's work has previously been anonymised for the safety of her co-artists. She is currently a member of several groups, including Deluxe artist film-makers.
